**As long as a road,**

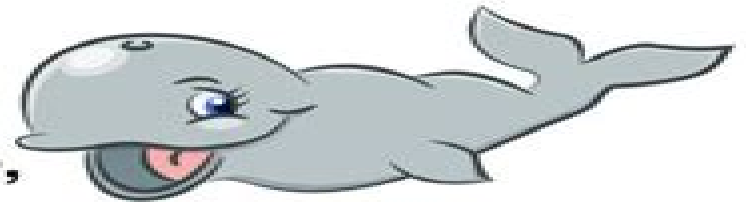
