Poems

Stanza: Consists of two or more lines that form one section or division of the poem.

Line: A line is one line contained within the stanza.

Repetition: Lines or words that are repeated. Lines and words that are repeated show the reader that they are important!



Dramas

Narrator:

The person who tells what happens.

Stage Directions:

This tells an actor or actress where to go. It is usually in italics & in parenthesis.
