What are pigs?

Pigs, also called hogs or swine, are farm animals. They belong to the group of animals called mammals. Mammals are covered with hair or fur. They feed on their mother's milk when they are young.



What do they look like?

Pigs have barrel-shaped bodies. Their body can be white, pink, or black. Some pigs have patches or spots. Look at the photo of the baby pig below. What is its color? Does it have spots?



Where do they live?

Pigs live on farms. They live in family groups called herds. They are often kept in large pig pens. In the wild, they live in woodlands.



How long do they live?

Lifespan is the length of time an animal is expected to live. Pigs that are well cared for have a lifespan of 15 to 20 years. Pigs in the wild live only 4 to 8 years.
