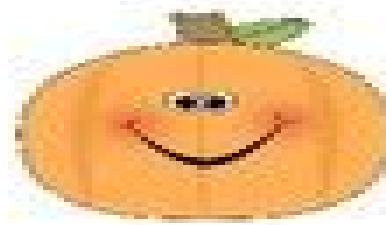
Receptive: point to what happened first/next/last.

First, he puts his book on.



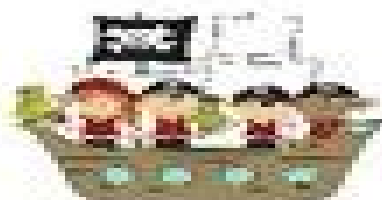
Next, he gets a horse.
