findings included statistically significant reductions in nighttime awakenings emergency department visits and use of rescue medications As part of the evaluation a sample of 17 caregivers participated in interviews with questions that focused on their perception of program quality impact and lessons learned As described in this report caregivers noted that CHWs helped them to develop knowledge and skills to reduce household asthma triggers in addition CHWs and Little Sisters proved to be influential advocates facilitating the settlement of complaints with housing management As New York State and local health care systems adopt and promote more community based health problems CAHR represents a promising example of an intervention that can produce improvements in asthma related health outcomes while supporting grassroots efforts to create changes in policies and practice
