I do, Teach Motivation	<p>"Beginning sequence word options on sentence strips cut and shown on side of board"</p> <p>"Have a pre-planned personal narrative ready to share and add details to, or use a shared personal narrative experience with the children. I (birthday, getting a pet, going somewhere special, vacation, first day of school etc.)</p> <p>"writers, yesterday you planned out the beginning, middle, and end to your stories by using the graphic organizer. Today I am going to show you how to turn your plans into a story with sentences."</p> <p>"I am going to tell my story by stretching it across these sections, a beginning, middle, and end. Listen and watch closely as I do. First, I look at the picture to remind myself what happened. Then I touch the first page and say what I am going to write." Touch section one: "First, I..."</p> <p>"Then I touch the second section and tell what happened next and what I am going to write." Touch section two: "Then I..."</p> <p>"Finally I touch the third page and tell what happened last." (Touch section three: "Last, I..."</p> <p>DNL: Use sketches, pictures or act out the story</p>
We Do it, Active Engagement	<p>"Writers, I just used my graphic organizer to help me recall the beginning, middle, and ending of my story. Today we are going to add words to our pictures by using sequence words to help tell our stories in order."</p> <p>Display children the different words they can use to start the beginning part of the story and go over them together. "What are some different words I can use to tell the beginning of my story?" (Should I start with last? Why should I begin my story by telling what happened first?)</p> <p>Think aloud as you look at what you drew in the beginning part of the graphic organizer and turn that into sentences. "Now let's turn this picture into words." Model writing that</p>
