Solve linear equations using multiplication and division and use linear equations to solve real-life problems

VOCABULARY

Properties of equality are rules of algebra that can be used to isolate a variable in an equation.

EXAMPLE 1**Dividing Each Side of an Equation**Solve $7n = -35$.**SOLUTION**To isolate n , you need to undo the multiplication by applying the inverse operation of dividing by 7.

$$7n = -35 \quad \text{Write original equation.}$$

$$\frac{7n}{7} = \frac{-35}{7} \quad \text{Divide each side by 7.}$$

$$n = -5 \quad \text{Simplify.}$$

The solution is -5 . Check by substituting -5 for n in the original equation.**Exercises for Example 1**
